

Pack 616 Spring Campout 2008

May 2-4

Directions to William Heise County Park

- Take Scripps Poway Parkway East
- Turn Left onto CA-Route 67
- Drive through Ramona
- CA-67 becomes CA-Route 78
- Pass Santa Ysabel (Dudley's Bakery) and stay on Route 78
- Turn Right onto Pine Hills Rd (At the William Heise Cty Park sign) just before the town of Julian.
- Turn Left onto Frisius Dr.
- Follow the country road to Heise Park Road-The entrance to the campground.
- We will be located just inside the main gate on the right side in the Caravan area. Check-in time: Friday after 2:00PM.
Checkout time: Sunday @1:00PM. (Campsites: C1-C20) Please pick up a park map at the front gate.

Estimated drive time: 1 hour

Our caravan campsite will have access to barricades so that no other campers at the park can drive through our area. This will also allow us to have a complete circle track for the boys to ride their bikes, scooters or skateboards. (Please make certain all boys wear their safety helmets.)

The bathroom is close to us. It is clean and has hot showers. Please bring extra paper towels to dry your hands.

There are plenty of tables for us to use. We may also move tables to our central eating area as long as a few people help carry them.

Please bring plenty of folding chairs for the campfires and a bundle of firewood to share.

Parking:

We have plenty of parking spaces for cars in our Caravan area. You will be able to park two cars in one parking spot.

There are electrical hookups and a dump station for RVs

Camp Rules:

- **Parents are responsible for their children at all times.**
- Wood pallets will not be permitted. Please bring regular wood that you would use in your fireplace.
- No alcoholic beverages will be permitted at any BSA function.
- Quiet time begins at 10:00PM.
- All cub scouts are encouraged to use the “Buddy System.”
- BSA Youth Protection Guidelines will be enforced at all times.
- Stay on the established trails and roads. Do not shortcut through the brush.
- No throwing rocks, dirt, or sticks at any time. All sports games such as baseball, soccer and Frisbee should be played in the meadow area and not near the Caravan camping area.
- Please keep our camp clean. Pick up all trash before you leave.
- Poison oak is near the hiking trails. Please stay away from it.
- There are signs that indicate Mountain Lions live in the area. The Ranger told us that it is highly unlikely that you will run across one. They stay in the high mountain areas and not around loud campsites. In the rare case that you should encounter a mountain lion do all that you can do to appear larger. Do not run from a lion. Do not crouch down or bend over.

Campout Checklist

Each Scout needs to bring:

- Gardening gloves to protect your hands for a park service project.
- A dish to share for the Saturday night potluck (Pack is providing hamburgers, hot dogs, condiments and paper goods)
 - Tigers: Salad or a side dish
 - Wolves: Salad or a side dish
 - Bears: Dessert
 - Webelos & parents: Dessert
- Drinks and water for your family (Pack will provide Juice packs/boxes, coffee and hot chocolate for breakfast)
- A bundle of wood to share

Other helpful items to bring:

- Flashlight
- Tent
- Ground cover/tarp
- Folding chairs
- Portable stove/fuel
- Matches
- Cooking gear
- Plastic table cloth
- Cooler with ice
- Paper towels/napkins
- Food/drinks/snacks
- Paper goods
- Skewers (s'mores)
- First aid kit
- Sunscreen
- Bug repellent
- Trash bags
- Lanterns
- Air mattress/pad
- Pillows/blankets
- Air pump/compressor
- Broom/dust pan
- Bottled water
- Baseball, glove
- Soccer balls
- Frisbees
- Horseshoes
- Bike/Bike helmets
- Dishwashing pans/soap
- Sponges/washcloth
- Towels
- Firewood/newspaper
- Camera/video/film
- Personal items
- Sleeping bags
- Rain gear if forecast goes bad!
- Warm jacket

Note - it's usually pretty cold at night this time of year, so make sure you have warm sleeping bags and you might also want some additional blankets. A beanie hat is also highly recommended to help keep you warm.
